GUEST LECTURER, 4TH ANNUAL VHCS/JCC WINTER LECTURE SERIES

The VHCS/JCC fourth winter/spring season of lectures and films will be opened by a special visit by Leopold and Mila (Pfefferberg) Page of Los Angeles. The Pages are survivors of Schindler's List. Mr. Page, the man most responsible for convincing Thomas Keneally to write this best selling book about Schindler's remarkable story, will address the community Monday evening, 8:00 p.m., February 7, 1994, in the Wosk Auditorium of the Jewish Community Centre. Mr. Page, a consultant to Stephen Spielberg, is travelling next to Paris, Krakow and Jerusalem with his wife to open the film in those locations. The Page's stay in Vancouver is sponsored jointly by the VHCS and the Consulate General of the Republic of Poland. Consul General Kryzstaf W. Kasprzyk, a personal friend of the Pages, arranged for the film to be shot on location in Poland.

Yom Ha'Shoa

April 8, 1994 27 Nissan, 5754

The fourth VHCS memorial inscription unveiling will take place at noon, on Yom Ha'Shaoh, Friday, April 8, 1994, at the Holocaust Memorial at Schara Tzedeck Cemetery, 2346 Marine in New Westminster. Memorial candles will be lit by survivors and their families.

In addition to remembering the six million Jews who died during the Holocaust, this service will be dedicated to remembering the Jews of Hungary, Carpathia and Transylvania in the 50th year since their deportation.

Following Hitler's rise to power in 1933, Hungary sought to form an alliance with Nazi Germany. This alliance was strengthened in 1944 with a change of government. The Nazis' plan for total deportation of Hungarian Jewry was put into effect in that year and began in Transcarpathian Ukraine. The Hungarian Jewish community lost 564,500 lives during the war, including 63,000 before the Nazi occupation.

A teacher's response to David Erlich's visit to her class: "Dear Mr. Erlich: I send you letters from the students in my three grade 10 classses. I don't know if you will find them helpful, as such, but they are heart felt. Every student was deeply moved by your story. As you saw, almost all asked the question, "How is it possible?". Your presence shows, beyond a shadow of a doubt, that it is possible. I was telling a colleague your story about the school in Salmon Arm shutting out the Aryan Nation and this person said, "You see...it is who gets to the kids first." Before you came, and as we started the unit, there were some who, in ignorance, were saying jokingly, "Oh, Hitler, he's great! Let me draw the swastikas." The third Reich has its attraction for young people - the sense of power, the smart color coordination you name it! But since you were here, those same students have turned their passions against Hitler. Their eyes have been opened. You were able to bring so much home to them, to make the whole unit of study come together and be real. I thank you, both for myself, my students and for the other staff members who all came to tell me how wonderful it was to hear you speak. (No one has seen that auditorim full of attentive for a long time!) Please, Mr. Ehrlich, be the one to keep on getting to our students first! I wish you a happy Hanukah and G-D bless you." The VHCS is now regularly loaning books, videos, posters and teachers manuals to schools around the province.

Survivors Robert Krell, Else Dunner, Bernard Goldberg, Esther Kaufman, Leo Lowy and Bronia Sonnenschein have all worked closely with local and national radio, T.V., and print media since the opening of the film, *Schindler's List*. They were joined in interviews by Kit Krieger, VHCS Education Committee cochair, and Professor William Nicholls. Dunner, Goldberg and Kaufman have the distinction of being *Schindlerjuden*, Schindler's Jews. All survived Plazow, Auschwitz and Brinnlitz, where they were liberated by the Russians.
